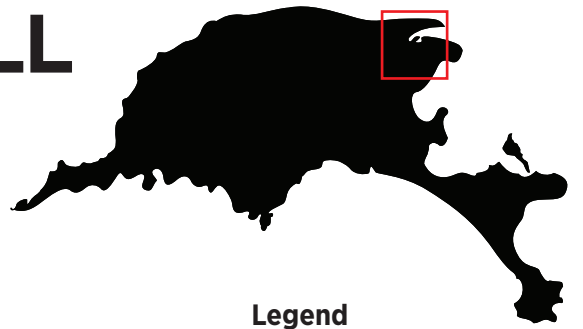


CONSERVATION HILL TO RHYLL TRAIL







WORLD CLASS WETLAND

Rhyll Inlet forms part of Western Port, which is listed as a wetland of international importance under the Ramsar Convention. This intergovernmental treaty supports national action and international cooperation for the conservation and wise use of wetlands and their resources.

A VITAL LINK

The wetlands of Rhyll Inlet are a vital link between the land and the sea. The mangroves provide critical habitat for numerous plants and animals, including marine snails, bivalves, and adult and juvenile fish. The extensive mudflats provide a wealth of food for waterbirds to feast on when the tide rolls out.
